Generally does not supply power directly to end-use equipment. Equipment inside usually includes isolating switches, circuit breakers, and residual current devices (RCDs).

Utilities may have some control over and access to the energy stored in electric vehicles attached to the grid.

Generally, first level distribution does not allow direct use of electrical equipment, and second level distribution will be by power equipment because it is three-phase electricity, while third ...

The secondary transmission is carried out via 3-phase systems while the distribution to the final consumer may be 3-phase or single phase depending upon the customer's needs.

These taps are typically single phase, but may also be two phases or three phases. Laterals can be directly connected to main trunks, but are more commonly protected by protective ...
