SFP28 ports are 25G speed ports and similar in size to a 10G SFP+ or 1G SFP port. They have supporting circuitry to enable 25G speed transceiver, DAC, and AOC components.

SFP+ optical modules and SFP+ cables can be plugged into the SFP28 port, it will not supports 25Gb / s data rate if the switch port doesn't support 25Gb only 10Gb.

A: It depends on the specific module and equipment. Some 25G SFP modules are designed to be backward compatible with 10G ports, but this is not universally true.
