Answer: No. Cable trays are a support system for electrical cables, power, signal, and communication and optical fiber cables. NEC section 300-8 does not permit any tube, pipe, or equal for water, air ...

Just as for ladder cable tray, ventilated trough cable tray will not pipe moisture into electrical equipment. Standard widths for ventilated trough cable tray systems are 6, 9, 12, 18, 24, 30, and 36 inches.
