Fiber optic cable sequential numbers are required at each pole location and vault wall. Sequential numbers will identify conduit length, and slack left in vaults and at poles.

In industrial tubes used in harsh environments like high pressure or temperature in heat exchangers, the issue of wall thinning due to flow accelerated corrosio

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Although most fiber optic cables are not conductive, any metallic hardware used in fiber optic cabling systems (such as wall-mounted termination boxes, racks, and patch panels) must be grounded.

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
