The cable armor must first be connected/bonded to a bonding or grounding electrode conductor. This can be done immediately after the cable has been accessible and the armor has ...

In practical implementations, conductive fiber optic cable will be bonded to the TMGB or the TGB (i.e. Central Office Ground Busbar, or COG Busbar) with a dedicated bonding conductor.

One of the simplest methods used for grounding the cable screen or armor is single-point grounding. In this method, the cables are grounded at only one point along their length to neutralize circulating ...

Place ground connector on exposed concentric wires at opening edge with braid extending toward opening. Hold ground wire in place and tightly wrap with 5 layers of tape at a point 6 inches (150 mm) ...
