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The main protection or primary protection is the first line protection which provides quick-acting and selective clearing of a fault within the boundary of the circuit section or element it protects.

Coordination refers to the process of applying relays to operate for faults in their primary zone of protection and within their backup zones, which extend beyond the primary zone.
